

Prelude: Though Bach's setting of this weekend's Hymn of the Day is widely played and sung by many, we have the unique opportunity this weekend to hear it in its proper context. Today the prelude pairs with the Hymn of the Day, "Come with Us, O Blessed Jesus." Listen for the hymn melody played on string stops, with interludes between each phrase.

Entrance Hymn: Historically called the "Oueen of Chorales" because of its prominent place in musical history, this hymn for Time after Epiphany is full of promises from God. In stanza 5, we sing good news: No matter the circumstance, "Christ goes with us all the way—today, tomorrow, and every day!" We worship a God who loved us "before the earth's foundation" and promises to be with us always. For this reason, we lift our voices in song!

Second Sunday after Epiphany

We gather to celebrate and proclaim the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Hymns are in the cranberry book, Evangelical Lutheran Worship.

How great is the sum of them!


