

"The Messianic Secret: (Shh...No Cross Before a Crown)" Pastor John Christopherson

Gospel: This story provides the turning point in Mark's gospel. Peter is the first human being in the narrative to acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah, but he cannot accept that as the Messiah Jesus will have to suffer. Moreover, Jesus issues a strong challenge to all by connecting discipleship and the cross.

Apostles' Creed: This is the faith into which all Christians are baptized. As we confess our faith in Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, recall that through God's Word and the Holy Spirit, we are joined to Christ's death and resurrection, and given a promise of life in Him.

Apostles' Creed

- **M** With the whole church, let us confess our faith.
- **G** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
 - I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church,

the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting. Amen.


